Recently, the Anishinaabe'aadziwin department received a donation of topsoil from Ruby Farms for the creation of a medicinal garden at the Heritage Centre.


We have created our garden and have a lot of topsoil left over!





I grew up catching snakes and frogs, learning about local plants and watching the birds and animals in the fields, wetlands and forests of Southern Ontario. I now live in London with my partner Myriam and our kids Teo and Aneya where our family is thankful for opportunities to walk regularly in the historic Attawandaron Woods and ecologically significant Medway Valley close to the Museum of Archaeology in the northwest of the city.

In my role as Climate Change Liaison in TLE, I am collaborating on a regional Integrated Watershed Management

mapping and planning project with Oneida, Delaware Chippewa, and Moraviantown First Nations, with support from Cambium Indigenous Professional Services, the Lower Thames Valley Regional Conservation Authority, the Canadian Environmental Law Association, Conservation Ontario and Green Communities Canada. Through our collaborative work, we are aiming to better understand the flood risks for First Nations communities located along Deshkan Zibii, and the roles for Traditional Knowledge be incorporated into climate risk to management and capacity-building efforts with First Nation communities, collaborators and partners.



The 2019 – 2021 Leadership term is coming to completion, for your information, the Board Election will take place at Antler River Elementary School on July 24, 2021.





# SKILLS 2 BUILD

#### GENERAL CONSTRUCTION

CTS Fanshawe is launching a new skills development program for the construction industry. The program will generate employment opportunities with local organizations in Southwestern Ontario and is completely free to qualifying participants.

#### **OVERVIEW**

The Skills2Build project has three distinct phases:

Pre-Employment Services and Training

The training portion of the program consists of 6 weeks of online and in-person training covering both soft and technical skills

**Employment Services** 

Upon completion of pre-employment training, participants are then paired with a local employer to complete a 6-week (full-time) paid work placement. Placement positions could include general labour, swimming pool installation, carpentry, roofing, etc. Participants are not required to find their own employer for the work placement portion of the program.

Retention and Advancement Services

Once the 6-week work placement has concluded, participants will receive approximately 6 additional weeks of 1:1 support with an Employment Consultant to help them work towards securing employment with either their work placement host or a similar employer in the industry.

#### REGISTRATION

#### PROGRAMS: SUPPORTIVE CARE ASSISTANT PROGRAM

#### Overview

The Supportive Care Assistant Program is a new fully subsidized microcertificate developed to address the labour shortages in the long-term care sector. The program allows you to discover a new career, gain work experience, and make a difference in your community.

The micro-certificate includes six weeks of online training and a four-month paid work placement. The program can help accelerate the next step of your career if you choose to pursue further studies and become a fully certified personal care provider

The program is funded by Employment and Social Development Canada and is part of CICan's Building Capacity in Long-term Care project.

#### **Program Outline**

The six-week online training is divided into learning modules and will prepare you for your role as a supportive care assistant.

Modules include: Professionalism; Client and Family-centred Assistance; Communication; Supportive Assistance; and Infection Control and Safety. There is also a module related to your work placement that will be completed before, during, and after your placement. Each module will take approximately 20 hours to complete and can be done at your own pace.

After completing the required modules, you will be connected to an employer who will provide 560 hours of paid employment over a four-month period.

Once you have successfully completed all the requirements, you will be granted a micro-certificate.

#### PROGRAMS: SUPPORTIVE CARE ASSISTANT CONT'D











#### **Project Goals**

The overarching goal is to help those who are unemployed or underemployed achieve the skill sets required for a variety of roles to help fill the needs and gaps present in the healthcare sector.

#### Program Delivery

Online with both self-directed and live virtual instruction from September 2021 to March 2022

Program modules include:

- Orientation to healthcare sector
- Essential workplace skills
- Practical supportive care skills
- Job-Readiness session
- Learning that supports individual needs


